Dear Doctor Porter:

I have long been a great admirer of your wonderful photography, but just recently learned that you are a physician. This latter information was of particular interest to me because of a major, new editorial project we are undertaking here.

Early next spring the AMA will launch a new, monthly socioeconomic magazine for circulation among 210,000 practicing physicians. I enclose a prospectus of the publication. When the prospectus was written, we thought that the title of the magazine would be Insight, but it now develops that we will use the name Prism. Nonetheless, I think the prospectus will give you an overview of our general editorial character and thrust.

One thing the prospectus does not do is to indicate the important emphasis we will place on photography. The magazine will probably be in an 11" X 11" format, and we are hopeful that this will give us an excellent opportunity to achieve visual impact. We are taking great care in our selection of a printer, with the same objective in mind.

As you know, physicians travel widely, are interested in the out doors, and many of them are avid camera buffs. A photo essay by you -- particularly since you are a physician -- would have great appeal for our audience. Also, I think an article telling how and why you decided to give up the practice of medicine and take up the art of photography would be fascinating to our readers. What the photographic selection would be in this latter instance I would leave to your judgment.

My only purpose here is to reflect our deep admiration for your work and to tell you how much we would like to publish some of it. Any ideas you may have for specific features would be extremely welcome.
