ELIOT PORTER

is internationally known for his outdoor color photography and books on conservation, including The Place No One Knew: Glen Canyon, Baja California, Galapagos, Down the Colorado, and In Wildness is the Preservation of the World, among others. He is working on four more. His photographs also have been exhibited in leading museums around the country.

E. BOYD

attended the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and the Academie de la Grande Chaumiere of Paris, painting and studying art history. After moving to New Mexico she became intensely interested in New Mexican santos. Miss Boyd has written for numerous art and historical publications, and she has a comprehensive book on Spanish New Mexican arts and crafts in the works now.

STAN STEINER

is best known as the author of The New Indians and La Raza: The Mexican Americans. He currently is writing a television documentary on the Black Mesa controversy and is editing three anthologies of La Raza, Indian and Puerto Rican literature. Mr. Steiner spent 20 years traveling around the country and getting to know the people in his books before he started writing about them.
