Neumayer Chem el is a narrow passage metween Wiencke mid Anvers islands and connecte Gerlache with Bismark Strait. The north entrance to the cliffs channel is its narroest part with perpendicular walks of rock hundreds of and feet high rising from the sea/surmounted by glaciers that extend down the gullies inxthe and ravines in the walls as hanging rivers of ice. Neumayer Channel widens to the south to provide a spectacular sight of the peaks of Wiencke Island where it joins bismark strait, and ten miles beyond the end of Anvers Island on the side facing Bismark strait is Palmer front station located on a spit of rock with the walk of Anvers glacier less than a half mile behind it. A group a islands a mile in front of this the site of Palmer form together with a longer naked spit of rock from Anvers Island form sheltered In this harbor. To a stone and masonry pier built out into deep water in front of the station the HERO tied up.

I was deposited with the Russians who x-rayed my shoulder put in a cast and treated me extremely well until I was finally rescued by the Glacier on January 28. The cast was removed on the Glacier and I flew Home from Tierra/Fuego with my arm in a sling.
